THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Radio Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subparagraph (a) of paragraph 14, and substituting the following subparagraph:

“(a) Ordinary £1 10s. per annum”.

(2) Nothing in this regulation shall apply to licences expiring before the 1st day of January 1954 and renewed before that date.

3. Where payment of a fee in respect of an ordinary broadcast receiving station licence is made on or after the 1st day of January 1954 (irrespective of the period of the licence for which the fee is paid) or is made in respect of a period commencing on or after that date (irrespective of the date of payment), the fee shall be the fee prescribed by subparagraph (a) of paragraph 14 of the First Schedule to the principal regulations, as substituted by subclause (1) of regulation 2 hereof.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations increase from 25s. to 30s. the fee for an ordinary radio receiving licence.
