

THE RADIO REGULATIONS 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 4

COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of August 1958

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Radio Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Regulation 93 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(b) An examination, partly practical and partly oral, in—
"(i) The adjustment and operation of typical radiotelephone

apparatus;

- **(ii) The working of accessory apparatus (such as motor generator sets and accumulators) used in radiocommunication; "(iii) Radio direction finding; and"
- 3. Regulation 94 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b), and substituting the following paragraph: "(b) An examination, partly practical and partly oral, in—

"(i) The adjustment and operation of typical radiotelephone

apparatus;

- "(ii) The working of accessory apparatus (such as motor generator sets and accumulators) used in radiocommunication; and
 - "(iii) Radio direction finding."

- 4. Regulation 122 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "class A3 emissions", and substituting the words "class F3 emissions".
- 5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 164, and substituting the following regulation:
- "164. An experimental station may, with the approval of the Minister, be operated by a person holding a lower qualification than that prescribed by regulation 163 hereof where the station is licensed only for—
 - "(a) The testing of transmitting apparatus connected to an approved non-radiating load and having an anode power input not exceeding 50 watts; or
 - "(b) The demonstration of transmitting apparatus having an anode power input not exceeding 50 watts where the operation of the transmitter requires only the use of simple external switching devices and does not require the manual adjustment of frequency determining elements."
- 6. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 169, the following regulation:
- "169A. Where a person discontinues the use of an experimental station in respect of which a licence fee has been paid, the Director-General may make a refund to the person who has paid the fee of a proportion thereof calculated in relation to the period of the licence during which the use of the station is discontinued."
- 7. Regulation 173 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso:

"Provided that any person who is not ordinarily resident in New Zealand who, in the country in which he is ordinarily resident, is the holder of an amateur station licence or an amateur operator's certificate may operate an amateur station under the direct supervision of the licensee of the station who shall be liable under these regulations for any breach thereof committed by any such person during the period he is operating the station."

- **8.** The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 181, and substituting the following regulation:
- "181. (1) Amateur stations shall use only such frequencies and classes of emission and shall observe such conditions as are determined from time to time by the Minister:

"Provided that every licensee of an amateur station who desires to operate on such frequencies in the high-frequency portion of the radio frequency spectrum as the Minister may from time to time prescribe in that behalf, shall be the holder of an amateur high-frequency permit.

- "(2) An amateur high-frequency permit shall be in such form and subject to such conditions, directions, and rules as the Minister may from time to time prescribe in that behalf.
- "(3) The fee for an amateur high-frequency permit shall be that prescribed in the First Schedule hereto."
- 9. Paragraph (f) of subclause (1) of regulation 206A of the principal regulations (as inserted by regulation 10 of the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 3) is hereby amended by adding the words "or is let on hire".

10. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after

regulation 212, the following regulation:

"212A. Where the holder of a radio hirer's licence for which a licence fee has been paid ceases to be in business as a radio hirer, the Director-General may make a refund to the licensee of a proportion of the fee calculated in relation to the period of the licence during which the licensee is not in business."

11. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after

regulation 224, the following regulation:

"224A. Where the holder of a radio dealer's licence for which a licence fee has been paid ceases to be in business as a radio dealer, the Director-General may make a refund to the licensee of a proportion of the fee calculated in relation to the period of the licence during which the licensee is not in business."

12. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended

by inserting, after clause 3, the following clause:

"3A. For an amateur high-frequency permit 5s."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations contain miscellaneous amendments to the principal regulations.

Provision is made for a person holding a lower qualification than that prescribed by regulation 163 to test transmitters which are connected to a non-radiating load and have an anode power input of up to 50 watts or to demonstrate transmiting apparatus having an anode power input not exceeding 50 watts where the operation of the transmitter requires only the use of simple external switches.

Provision is made for a visitor to this country who, in the country in which he ordinarily resides, is the holder of an amateur station licence or an amateur operator's certificate to operate an amateur station under the direct supervision

of the licensee.

A new provision for the issue of a high-frequency permit where an amateur desires to operate on such frequencies in the high-frequency portion of the radio frequency spectrum as the Minister may prescribe has been inserted.

A fee is prescribed in respect of the issue of an amateur high-frequency permit. Provision is made for a refund of the licence fee in respect of the unexpired period of certain classes of licence where a person ceases to be in business.
