



**THE RADIOCOMMUNICATIONS (RADIO) REGULATIONS 1993,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

PURSUANT to the Radiocommunications Act 1989, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Radiocommunications (Radio) Regulations 1993, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Radiocommunications (Radio) Regulations 1993* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 25th day of October 1996.

2. Fees—Regulation 53 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subclause (2), the following subclause:

“(2A) Where,—

“(a) A person holds a licence in respect of apparatus used for the purpose of radiocommunication on a frequency or frequencies; and

“(b) In order to make that frequency or those frequencies available for a different usage, the Secretary grants to that person (or any other person) a licence in respect of apparatus used for the purpose of radiocommunication on a different frequency or frequencies,—

the Secretary may waive, in whole or in part, the payment of any fee (including any application fee) payable under these regulations in respect of the licence to which paragraph (b) of this subclause applies.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 25 October 1996, amend the Radiocommunications (Radio) Regulations 1993. The regulations insert *new subclause (2A)* in regulation 53 of the principal regulations. Regulation 53 provides for the fees that may be charged under the principal regulations and the situations where the Secretary may waive those fees.

New subclause (2A) allows the Secretary to waive the payment of certain fees where a licence holder, in respect of apparatus used for the purpose of radiocommunication on a frequency, is granted another licence for a different frequency so that the original frequency is available for a different usage.
