**THE RABBIT-DESTRUCTION (KIWITEA RABBIT DISTRICT)  
REGULATIONS 1948**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 10th day of  
November, 1948

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Rabbit-destruction (Kiwitea Rabbit District) Regulations 1948.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.

(3) In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—

“The said Act” means the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928 :

“Board” means the Kiwitea Rabbit Board established under the said Act.

2. The regulations made under the said Act on the 9th day of June, 1924, and published in the *Gazette* on the 19th day of the same month at page 1459, are hereby revoked.

3. These regulations shall apply to the rabbit district within the jurisdiction of the Board.

4. The Board may at any time or times in any year publicly notify, by notice published twice in some one or more newspapers circulating in the Kiwitea Rabbit District, that all trapping, shooting, and hunting of rabbits, whether with dogs or otherwise, and/or poisoning of or laying of poison for rabbits within the said district is prohibited for a period not exceeding six months from a date to be specified in such notice (being a date not earlier than seven days after the first publication of such notice), and while such prohibition is in force no

person shall (except with the permission of the Board granted pursuant to a resolution of the Board and evidenced by writing under the hand of the Secretary or Clerk to the Board, and subject to the conditions specified therein) trap, shoot, or hunt and/or poison or lay poison for, or permit to be trapped, shot, or hunted (whether with dogs or otherwise) and/or poisoned or permit poison to be laid for any rabbits upon any land within the said district.

5. Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.
