ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 21st day of September 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Subclause (1) of regulation 29 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:

(a) By omitting from paragraph (a) the words "natural or artificial minnow", and substituting the words "artificial minnow":

(b) By omitting from paragraph (a) the words "small indigenous fish, or":

(c) By omitting from paragraph (b) the words "the matuku", and substituting the words "any species of bittern".

3. Regulation 36 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 4) is hereby amended as follows:

(a) By inserting in paragraph (a) of subclause (1), after the words "other than", the words "a natural fly, grasshopper, beetle, spider, or insect or":

(b) By revoking paragraph (w) of subclause (3).

4. Regulation 37 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b), and substituting the following paragraphs:

“(b) The Wairua Stream:

“(c) The Otara River.”

5. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as substituted by regulation 7 of the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the Third Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 7 of the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3, and the Schedule thereto are hereby revoked.

(3) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words “or as to whether or not he or any other person is attending school full time”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations make miscellaneous amendments to the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951.

Regulation 2 prohibits the use as lures of natural minnow, small indigenous fish, and the feathers of any species of bittern.

Regulation 3 permits the use of natural fly as baits in the waters to which regulation 36 of the principal regulations applies, and removes the prohibition on spoon fishing and trolling on lakes Rotoroa, Rotongaio, and Rotonui-a-ha.

Regulation 4 removes the prohibition on fishing in that portion of Lake Tarawera which lies within a 200 yards radius of the mouth of the Wairua Stream, and prohibits fishing in the Otara River.

Regulation 5 substitutes a new scale of licence fees.
