THE ROTOAIRA TROUT FISHING REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 2

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 28th day of March 1966

PURSUANT to Part I of the Maori Purposes Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Rotoaira Trout Fishing Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rotoaira Trout Fishing Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Regulation 17 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:
- "(4) Nothing in subclause (2) of this regulation shall authorise the holder of an entry permit to fish for trout in Lake Rotoaira and the said stream in any period during which fishing has been lawfully prohibited pursuant to regulation 30 of these regulations."
- 3. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subclause (4) the following proviso:
- "Provided that the holder of an annual entry permit shall not be entitled to have any part of the entry fee refunded to him unless the Trustees have lawfully prohibited fishing in accordance with this regulation for a period or periods totalling more than two months in the period of 12 months for which the annual entry permit is issued."

*S.R. 1959/206 Amendment No. 1: S.R. 1960/138 4. Form 1 in the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "pursuant to the conditions of issue of that licence", the words "[Add, where the permit is for the purposes of fishing]. The holder of this permit is not entitled to enter upon the said lake or stream for the purpose of fishing in any period during which the Trustees have, by notice in the Gazette, prohibited fishing."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 provides that the holder of an entry permit will not be entitled to fish during any period that the Trustees have lawfully prohibited fishing on Lake Rotosira

Regulation 3 provides that holders of annual entry permits shall not be entitled to claim refunds unless the Trustees close the lake for at least a total of two months during the period of 12 months covered by the permit.
