



**THE ROTORUA TROUT-FISHING REGULATIONS 1939,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of
September, 1944

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1944.

4. Regulation 35 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the paragraph numbered (iii) of clause (1) thereof, and substituting the following paragraph :—

“(iii) Any leaden or other weight on or in connection with a line, including a weight embodied in the hook or other part of a fly, but excluding the weight of a lure consisting solely of a metal hook dressed in accordance with accepted practice so as to become an artificial fly.”
