**THE ROTORUA TROUT-FISHING REGULATIONS 1939,
AMENDMENT NO. 7**

THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 7.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1948.

4. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting next following the words "fish for", the words "take and kill".

5. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

"11. The fees for licences shall be those set out in the following table:—

6. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting next following the words "fish for", the words "take and kill".

7. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting next following the words "fish for", the words "take and kill".

8. Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the words "and the lure or bait used by him for taking, catching, or killing trout", and substituting the words "and any lure or bait in his possession".

9. Regulation 29 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the word "ten" where it twice occurs, and substituting in each case the word "six".

10. Regulation 34 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

"34. No person shall take any fish from any net, trap, pound-net, or other contrivance used by any person for the purposes of acclimatization, propagation, pisciculture, scientific investigation, or for scientific or other purposes pursuant to Regulations 45 and 45A hereof, or shall in any way interfere with or damage any such net, trap, pound-net, or other contrivance."

11. Regulation 36 of the principal regulations, as replaced by Regulation 4 of the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 4, is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

"36. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations or contained in any licence issued under these regulations, no person shall, during the period commencing on the 1st day of November, 1948, and terminating on the 14th day of May, 1951, fish for, take, or kill trout by any means whatsoever in or from the following waters, being waters in which trout fry have been placed, namely, the Wairoa Stream between the waterfalls and Lake Tarawera, and the Wairoa Stream and that portion of Lake Tarawera within an arc drawn from shore to shore having a radius of 200 yards from the centre of the meeting-line of the said Wairoa Stream and the said lake."

12. Regulation 42 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted:—

"42. No acclimatization society or person shall, without the written authority of the Under-Secretary of the Department of Internal Affairs, place, liberate, or introduce in or into any lake, river, stream, or other waters within the district any indigenous or exotic species of mollusca, crustacea, protozoa, insecta, or of annelid nematode or platyhelminth worm or any fish or fish ova of any description."

13. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, next following Regulation 45, the following regulations:—

"45A. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations, any person authorized in writing in that behalf by the Under-Secretary of the Department of Internal Affairs may, by any method whatsoever, fish for, take, or kill fish from any waters in the district at any time, whether during the open season or the close season, for the purposes of pisciculture or scientific investigation, and may have in his possession fish taken for such purposes."

“ 45B. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations, any officer of the Marine Department or any officer of the Department of Internal Affairs, acting in either case in the course of his official duties, and with the written authority of the Under-Secretary of the Department of Internal Affairs, may take fish in any waters within the district for the purposes of pisciculture or scientific investigation by the use of narcotic or poisonous matter or liquid to stupefy or kill the fish, and may have in his possession fish so taken for such purposes.”

14. The Third Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting next following the words “ fish for ”, the words “ take and kill ”.

15. The Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1, and the Rotorua Trout-fishing Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 4, are hereby revoked.
