



**THE SUPERANNUATION (JUDICIAL AND OTHER
STATUTORY SALARIES) ORDER 1976**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 20th day of December 1976

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 7 of the Finance Act 1976, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Superannuation (Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries) Order 1976.

2. Application of order—This order applies to every person whose salary scale was, at any time on or after the 9th day of July 1976, fixed by the Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 2) 1976*, and who was, at any time on or after the 9th day of July 1976, a contributor to the Government Superannuation Fund, whether or not he has retired.

3. Election to contribute as if higher salary were payable—Every person to whom this order applies may, before the 15th day of May 1977, by notice in writing addressed to the Superintendent of the Government Superannuation Fund elect to contribute to that Fund, as from the 9th day of July 1976 or the date on which he became a contributor to the Fund, whichever is the later, as if the increase in salary to which he would be entitled, if the Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 3) 1976† were in force, had been payable from the 9th day of July 1976.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order enables certain judicial and other statutory officers to elect to contribute to the Government Superannuation Fund as if their salaries had been increased from the 9th day of July 1976 by the Judicial and Other Statutory Salaries Order (No. 3) 1976 (which does not in fact come into force until the 15th day of May 1977).
