PURSUANT to the Law Practitioners Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Solicitors Audit Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Solicitors Audit Regulations 1938\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Clause (6) of regulation 6 of the principal regulations, as substituted by paragraph (c) of regulation 7 of the Solicitors Audit Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 2, and amended by regulation 2 of the Solicitors Audit Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 3, is hereby further amended by inserting, after the word "auditor", the words "and to the Secretary of the New Zealand Law Society".
