



**THE SHIPPING AND SEAMEN ACT WIRELESS REGULATIONS
1925, AMENDMENT NO. 4.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of April, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section two of the Shipping and Seamen Amendment Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regulations 1925, Amendment No. 4.

2. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context, "principal regulations" mean the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regulations 1925.*

3. So long as these amending regulations continue in force, Regulation 10 of the principal regulations shall be read subject to the following provisions :—

- (a) In addition to the grades provided for by clause (1) of Regulation 10 of the principal regulations, the following grades shall be recognized—namely, provisional first-grade, provisional second-grade, and provisional third-grade :
- (b) An operator shall be deemed to hold a provisional first-grade, provisional second-grade, or provisional third-grade certificate if he holds respectively a radio-telegraph operator's certificate (first class), a radio-telegraph operator's certificate (second class), or a radio-telegraph operator's certificate (third class) issued under Regulation 23 of the Radio Regulations 1932† and irrespective of his experience.
- (c) The holding of a provisional first-grade, provisional second-grade, or provisional third-grade certificate respectively shall entitle a person to hold any position and discharge any service for which the holding of a first-grade, second-grade, or third-grade certificate respectively is required by the principal regulations.
