THE STOCK BRANDING REGULATIONS 1957

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of March 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Stock Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Stock Branding Regulations 1957.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1957.

2. The fee which shall accompany any application for the registration or transfer of a brand for stock shall be 10s. in respect of each description of brand to be registered or transferred.

3. The fee payable for the registration of any standard stock mark shall be £1 1s., and that fee shall be forwarded to the Director-General of Agriculture with the application for registration.

4. The Standard Marks Stock Regulations 1929* are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the fees that are payable on applications for the registration or transfer of brands for stock and on the registration of standard stock marks.
