**THE SUBMARINE CABLES AND PIPELINES
PROTECTION ORDER 1967**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 7th day of February 1967

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Submarine Cables and Pipelines Protection Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Submarine Cables and Pipelines Protection Order 1967.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The areas within the territorial sea or internal waters of New Zealand described in the First Schedule to this order are hereby declared to be protected areas for the purposes of the Submarine Cables and Pipelines Protection Act 1966.

3. The area within the fishing zone of New Zealand described in the Second Schedule to this order is hereby declared to be a restricted area for the purposes of the Submarine Cables and Pipelines Protection Act 1966.

4. This order applies generally with respect to all ships within the protected areas declared by clause 2 of this order and to New Zealand fishing boats within the restricted area declared by clause 3 of this order.

SCHEDULES

Clause 2

FIRST SCHEDULE

PROTECTED AREAS

AREA 1

All the waters of Cook Strait bounded by a right line drawn from the shore of the North Island low-water mark at a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 19.4' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 38.1' E$ to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 19.7' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 33.8' E$ thence by a right line to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 16.9' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 32.8' E$ thence by a right line to the shore of the North Island at low-water mark at a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 16.5' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 36.9' E$ thence by the line of low-water mark to the point of commencement.

AREA 2

All the waters of Cook Strait bounded by a right line drawn from the shore of the South Island at low-water mark at a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 18.5' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 14.2' E$ thence to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 18.1' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 18.6' E$ thence by a right line to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 21.0' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 17.6' E$ thence by a right line to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 21.4' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 13.0' E$ thence by a right line to the shore of the South Island at low-water mark at a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 20.4' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 10.8' E$ thence by the line of low-water mark to the point of commencement.

Clause 3

SECOND SCHEDULE

RESTRICTED AREA

AREA 3

All the waters of Cook Strait bounded by a right line drawn from a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 19.7' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 33.8' E$ to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 21.0' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 17.6' E$ thence by a right line to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 18.1' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 18.6' E$ thence by a right line to a point in latitude $41^{\circ} 16.9' S$ longitude $174^{\circ} 32.8' E$ thence by a right line to the point of commencement.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order declares certain areas in Cook Strait to be protected and restricted areas for the purposes of the Submarine Cables and Pipelines Protection Act 1966.

The effect of the order is that anyone fishing from or anchoring any ships within the prescribed protected area commits an offence against the Submarine Cables and Pipelines Protection Act 1966. Anyone fishing from or anchoring a New Zealand fishing boat within the prescribed restricted area similarly commits an offence against the Act.
