THE SUPREME COURT AMENDMENT RULES (NO. 2) 1957

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 3rd day of December 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Judicature Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and seven of the other members of the Rules Committee constituted under the Judicature Amendment Act 1930 (four of those other members being Judges of the Supreme Court), hereby makes the following rules.

R U L E S

1. These rules may be cited as the Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 2) 1957, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Code of Civil Procedure set out in the Second Schedule to the Judicature Act 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the Code).

2. The Code is hereby amended by revoking rule 602 (as substituted by rule 7 of the Supreme Court Amendment Rules 1957*), and substituting the following rule:

“602. **Office hours**—The offices of the Court shall be open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on every day not being a Saturday, a Sunday, or a Court holiday:

Provided that during the Easter vacation, and from the 23rd day of December to the 20th day of January (both days inclusive) of the long vacation, the offices shall close at 1 p.m.”
