**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of June 1975

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Judicature Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and at least two of the other members of the Rules Committee (of whom at least one was a Judge of the Supreme Court), hereby makes the following rules.

**R U L E S**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These rules may be cited as the Supreme Court (Administrative Division) Rules 1969, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Supreme Court (Administrative Division) Rules 1969\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules).

(2) These rules shall come into force on the 7th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Application of rules**—Rule 2 of the principal rules is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) These rules shall not apply to any proceedings referred to the Administrative Division by the Chief Justice pursuant to section 26 (1) (c) of the Judicature Act 1908.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These rules amend the Supreme Court (Administrative Division) Rules 1969. The procedure prescribed by those rules does not apply to certain matters referred to the Administrative Division by the Chief Justice pursuant to section 26 (1) (c) of the Judicature Act 1908. The effect of the amendment is that those rules will not apply to any matter (including an application for review made under Part I of the Judicature Amendment Act 1972) so referred under the said section 26 (1) (c).
