

## THE SELENIUM CONTROL REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 2

Pursuant to the Poisons Act 1960, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Selenium Control Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Selenium Control Regulations 1959\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. (1) The Schedule to the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Selenium Control Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by omitting all items after the item "Photoelectric cells", and substituting the following items:

"Pig food supplements and poultry food supplements if they contain not more than 300 parts per million of selenium.

The preparation used in the treatment of dogs and known by the trade name of 'Seleen'.

Preparations for the treatment of dandruff.

Preparations for the treatment of metals.

Rubber and articles made of rubber.

Synthetic resins and articles made of synthetic resins."

(2) The Selenium Control Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 1, are hereby revoked.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations free pig food supplements containing not more than 300 parts per million of selenium, preparations for the treatment of dandruff, and preparations for the treatment of metals from the restrictions imposed by the Selenium Control Regulations 1959 on the sale of preparations containing selenium.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 6 April 1966. These regulations are administered in the Department of Health.
