

# THE SPRAY COATING REGULATIONS 1962, AMENDMENT NO. 3

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 27th day of September 1982

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956 and the Factories and Commercial Premises Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Spray Coating Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Spray Coating Regulations 1962\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- **2.** Interpretation—(1) Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term "Chief Inspector", the following definitions:
  - "'Chopped-strand spraying' means the propulsion through a chopping mechanism and onto a mould, by means of a jet of compressed air, of glass-fibre rovings, resins, and catalysts:

- "Gel coating means the application to the surfaces of moulds, by means of a spray, of a mixture of resins and pigments, for the purpose of providing smooth outer skins for mouldings produced from those moulds:".
- (2) The said regulation 2 is hereby further amended by adding to the definition of the term "Spray coating" the words "; but does not include chopped-strand spraying or gel coating".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations exclude from the ambit of the principal regulations the industrial processes known as chopped-strand spraying and gel coating.
