THE STOCK (CATTLE TICK) REGULATIONS 1940 (REPRINT)

GALWAY, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 31st day of July 1940

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Stock Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Stock (Cattle Tick) Regulations 1940.
- 2. These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
 - 3. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context,—
 "The said Act" means the Stock Act 1908:
 - The terms "cattle", "Inspector", and "sheep" have the respective meanings assigned to them by the said Act.
- 4. The respective regulations made under the said Act and referred to in the First Schedule hereto are revoked.
- 5. All permits and generally all acts of authority and all other documents, matters, acts, and things which originated or had effect under the regulations hereby revoked and are of continuing effect at the time of coming into force of these regulations shall enure for the purposes of these regulations as if they had originated under these regulations, and shall, where necessary, be deemed to have so originated.

- [6. No person shall transport any cattle or sheep, or cause any cattle or sheep to be transported, from any place in the North Island to any place in the South Island, except in pursuance of a permit granted under these regulations.
- 7. No person shall transport any cattle or sheep, or cause any cattle or sheep to be transported, from any place in the North Island to any place in the South Island, except at the places and within the time specified in a permit granted under these regulations.]

Regulations 6 and 7 were substituted for the original regulations 6 and 7 by regulation 2 of S.R. 1955/43.

- 8. Every permit granted under these regulations shall be in or to the effect of the form in the Second Schedule hereto.
- [9. Any person desiring to transport any cattle or sheep from the North Island to the South Island shall make application to an Inspector for a permit under these regulations to transport the cattle or sheep.]

This regulation was substituted for the original regulation 9 by regulation 3 of S.R. 1955/43.

- 10. Before granting any permit under these regulations the Inspector may require the cattle or sheep comprised in the proposed shipment to be dipped under his supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector by complete immersion in an effective cattle tick-destroying solution or fluid, or to be sprayed by the same solution or fluid, or to be subjected to such other effective means of cattle tick destruction as may be authorised by the Inspector.
- 11. Every person who fails to observe or perform any duty directly or by implication placed upon him by these regulations, or does anything contrary to the provisions thereof, commits a breach of these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of £50.
