**THE STAMP DUTIES EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939,  
AMENDMENT NO. 2.**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 21st day of  
May, 1941.

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Stamp Duties Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Stamp Duties Emergency Regulations 1939 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. The principal regulations are amended by adding thereto the following additional regulation :—

“ 5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Stamp Duties Act, 1923, no stamp duty shall be payable on a receipt given in respect of any allowance made by His Majesty to any person who, or to any dependant of any person who, is performing in New Zealand or elsewhere naval, military, or air service in connection with any war in which His Majesty may, during the continuance of these regulations, be engaged.”
