PURSUANT to subsection (2) of section 6 of the Secondhand Dealers Amendment Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Secondhand Dealers Order 1957.
2. The Second Schedule to the Secondhand Dealers Amendment Act 1934 is hereby amended as follows:
 - (a) By omitting from the item relating to bicycles, etc., the words "and motor cycles":
 - (b) By inserting, after the words "Motor vehicle", the words "(including motor cycle)":
 - (c) By inserting, after the words "Musical instruments", the words "other than pianos".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order excludes motor cycles and pianos from the Second Schedule to the Secondhand Dealers Amendment Act 1934. This means that it will no longer be necessary for secondhand dealers to hold them for a month before disposing of them.

As in the case of motor vehicles, tools, spare parts, and accessories of motor cycles will continue to be included in the Second Schedule.
