**THE SALT-WATER FISHERIES AMENDMENT
REGULATIONS 1939, NO. 2.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of April, 1939.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Salt-water Fisheries Amendment Regulations 1939, No. 2.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made on the 29th day of June, 1932,* with respect to fish, shell-fish, and other matters (hereinafter called the principal regulations) and the amendments thereof.
3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification thereof in the *Gazette*.†
4. The Salt-water Fisheries Amendment Regulations 1939, made on the 14th day of February, 1939‡, are revoked.
5. Regulation 8 of the Salt-water Fisheries Amendment Regulations 1938§ is amended by adding thereto the following additional paragraphs and heading :—

“ Bay of Plenty.

- “(c) In those waters of the sea within a distance of two nautical miles from low-water mark of the shore that extends from a point on the coast at the mouth of the Waiaua River, approximately five miles eastward of Opotiki, to a point on the coast three miles westward of Matata, which latter point is shown on the plan marked M.D. 7106, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, but excluding therefrom—

“(i) Those waters of Whakatane Harbour and the sea within the arc of a circle having a radius of one nautical mile from the signal-station on Kohi Point.

“(ii) Those waters of Ohiwa Harbour and the sea within the arc of a circle having a radius of two nautical miles from the north-easternmost point of the western entrance to the Ohiwa River.

“(iii) Those waters of Opotiki Harbour and the sea within the arc of a circle having a radius of two nautical miles from the north-easternmost point of the western entrance to the Opotiki River.”
