## THE STOCK IMPORTATION AMENDING REGULATIONS 1953

### C. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 2nd day of September 1953

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Stock Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1953, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations for the prevention of the introduction into New Zealand of diseases affecting stock made under the Stock Act 1908 on the 4th day of October 1915, and published in the *Gazette* on the 7th day of the same month at page 3420 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of their publication in the *Gazette*.

#### PART I-MISCELLANEOUS AMENDMENTS

2. (1) Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the proviso, as substituted by regulation 2 of the regulations made under the Stock Act 1908 in amendment of the principal regulations on the 3rd day of May 1934 and published in the *Gazette* on the 10th day of that month at page 1391, and substituting the following proviso:

"Provided that it shall be lawful for any person with a prior permit in writing from the Minister, or from the Director-General of Agriculture with the authority of the Minister, and subject to such conditions as may be specified in the permit, to introduce into New Zealand meat which has been preserved or otherwise processed into any meat product or any other portion of the carcass of any stock which has been manufactured into meat meal, bone meal, bone flour, or other food for stock or poultry other than animal manure in respect of which specific provision is made by these regulations."

(2) The said regulations made under the Stock Act 1908 on the 3rd day of May 1934 are hereby revoked.

3. Regulation 9 of the principal regulations and the heading of that regulation, as substituted by regulation 6 of the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1947,\* are hereby amended as follows:

- (a) By inserting, after the words "Great Britain" in the heading and in subclause (3) of the regulation, the words "or the Channel Islands ":
- (b) By inserting, after the words "from Great Britain" in subclause (1), the words "or the Channel Islands". 4. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations and the heading to

that regulation, as inserted by regulation 4 of the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1945<sup>†</sup>, are hereby amended by inserting, after the words "United Kingdom" where they occur in the heading and in subclauses (1) and (2) of the regulation, the words "the Channel Islands ".

5. Regulation 40 of the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 7 of the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1947,\* is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from subclause (1) the words "Dogs from the United Kingdom and Eire", and substituting the words "Dogs from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands, and Eire ":
- (b) By inserting, after the words "Goats from Great Britain", the words "and the United States of America":
- (c) By omitting the words "Sheep from Canada and Great Britain", and substituting the words "Sheep from Canada, Great Britain, and the United States of America ":
- (d) By adding the following subclause:

"(3) Where any dog is exempted from quarantine at a quarantine ground and permitted to be landed subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of subclause (2) of this regulation, an Inspector may require the owner of the dog to enter into a bond of not more than  $\pounds 50$  for the due observance and performance by the owner of his obligations under that paragraph in respect of his dog."

6. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 72, the following regulation:

"72A. (1) Except for the purpose of shipment from New Zealand, no person owning or being in charge of any dog born in or lawfully introduced into New Zealand shall bring it or cause or permit it to be brought on board any foreign going or Australasian vessel, and no master of any such vessel shall knowingly permit any such dog to enter or remain on board any such vessel.

"(2) If any such dog is found on board any foreign going or Australasian vessel it may be seized by any Inspector, Officer of Customs, or Constable and removed from the vessel without relieving any person from any liability he may have incurred for a breach of this regulation."

7. The Fourth Schedule to the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 9 of the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1947,\* is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "Great Britain" wherever they occur in forms numbers 3, 4, and 5, the words " or the Channel Islands".

8. The Sixth Schedule to the principal regulations, as inserted by regulation 6 of the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1945<sup>†</sup>, is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "United Kingdom" in the headings to forms numbers 1 and 2, the words "the Channel Islands".

9. The Fifteenth Schedule to the principal regulations as heretofore amended is hereby further amended by inserting, after the words "Dogs from the United Kingdom" which were inserted by regulation 7 of the Stock Importation Amending Regulations 1945<sup>†</sup>, the words "the Channel Islands".

# PART II—CATTLE, SHEEP, AND GOATS FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

10. For the purpose of this part of these regulations "prohibited area" means the counties of Cameron, Hidalgo, Kinney, Maverick, Starr, Valverde, Webb, and Zapata in the State of Texas and the County of Volusia in the State of Florida, and includes any land within fifty miles of the boundaries of any of those counties.

11. (1) Subject to the provisions of these regulations, cattle, sheep, and goats may be introduced into New Zealand from any place in the United States other than any place within the prohibited area.

(2) Every person intending to introduce cattle, sheep, or goats as aforesaid shall first obtain a permit to do so from the Minister of Agriculture.

12. (1) Every shipment of any such cattle or goats shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form numbered 1 in the Schedule hereto made by the owner of the cattle or goats.

(2) On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto signed by a veterinarian in the full time employ of the Bureau of Animal Industry or any State of the United States of America.

13. (1) Every shipment of any such sheep shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form numbered 3 in the Schedule hereto made by the owner of the sheep.

(2) On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate in the form numbered 4 in the Schedule hereto signed by a veterinarian in the full time employ of the Bureau of Animal Industry or any State of the United States of America.

14. Every declaration and the certificate provided for in this Part of these regulations shall be delivered to the veterinarian who, pursuant to regulation 19 of the principal regulations, examines at the port of shipment cattle, sheep, or goats intended for introduction into New Zealand.

15. The regulations which were made under the Stock Act 1908 on the 6th day of February 1928 and published in the *Gazette* of the 16th day of that month at page 406 and which govern the importation of cattle from the United States of America are hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations amend the regulations relating to the prevention of the introduction into New Zealand of diseases affecting stock. They define the circumstances in which cattle and dogs may be imported from the Channel Islands and the circumstances in which cattle, sheep, and goats may be imported from the United States of America. They provide that the entry of preserved or processed meat is to be subject to the requirement of a prior permit being obtained. They provide that importers of dogs may be required to enter into a bond of not less than £50 binding them to observe the conditions on which the dogs are introduced. They also make it an offence to allow any dog lawfully present in New Zealand to go on board any overseas vessel.
