**THE SAMOA IMPORT CONTROL REGULATIONS 1944,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of December 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Samoa Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Samoa Import Control Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Samoa Import Control Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause as subclause (2) thereof:

“(2) Where—

“(a) Any goods have been imported into Western Samoa (whether before or after the commencement of this subclause) pursuant to a licence granted under these regulations and the licence was granted upon or subject to any term or condition; and

“(b) Any person—

“(i) Commits any breach of or fails in any respect to comply with that term or condition; or

“(ii) Is knowingly concerned in any such breach or non-compliance; or

“(iii) Makes or causes or permits to be made any statement as to compliance with that term or condition that is false or misleading in any material particular—

he is liable to a fine not exceeding £200 or the value of the goods, whichever is the greater, and the goods shall be forfeited.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations make it an offence for any person to fail to comply with any condition on which an import licence is granted for the importation of goods into Western Samoa. The maximum penalty for a breach is a fine of £200 or the value of the goods, whichever is the greater, and the goods will be forfeited.
