**THE SOUTHLAND INLAND HARBOURS REGULATIONS 1970,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of April 1977

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Southland Inland Harbours Regulations 1970, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Southland Inland Harbours Regulations 1970* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Navigation in Upper Waiau River—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 4 (as added by regulation 2 of the Southland Inland Harbours Regulations 1970, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following regulation:

“4. (1) No person shall navigate any vessel on the Upper Waiau River in any of the waters described in subclause (2) of this regulation.

“(2) The waters referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation are all the waters of the Upper Waiau River between the floating boat boom above the Lake Te Anau control structure and a straight line across the river parallel to and 60 m below the control structure, as delineated by a red edge on the plan numbered MD 15752 at the head office of the Ministry of Transport at Wellington.

“(3) Notwithstanding subclause (1) of this regulation, a person engaged as a contractor by or employed by the New Zealand Electricity Department, and engaged in maintenance work on the control structure, may for the purposes of undertaking such contract or employment, navigate a vessel on the waters described in subclause (2) of this regulation.

“(4) Every person who commits a breach of this regulation commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.”

(2) The Southland Inland Harbours Regulations 1970, Amendment No. 1, are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations restrict navigation on the Upper Waiiau River in the vicinity of the Lake Te Anau control structure. They replace the Southland Inland Harbours Regulations 1970, Amendment No. 1.
