# THE SHIPPING LIFESAVING APPLIANCES RULES 1960, AMENDMENT NO. 3

Pursuant to the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following rules.

#### RULES

- 1. (1) These rules may be cited as the Shipping Lifesaving Appliances Rules 1960, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shipping Lifesaving Appliances Rules 1960\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules).
- (2) These rules shall come into force on the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Rule 50 of the principal rules is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "and every ship of 100 ft in length and over of Class VIII (A), X, or XI".
- 3. Rule 50 of the principal rules is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (2) the words "Every ship of Class III, and every ship of less than 100 ft in length of Class VIII (A) or XI, and every ship of less than 100 ft in length of Class X which proceeds beyond river limits", and substituting the words "Every ship of Class III, VIII (A), or XI, and every ship of Class X which proceeds beyond river limits".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Rule 50 (1) of the principal rules provides that every ship of 100 ft in length and over of Class VIII (A), X, or XI must be provided with not less than 12 parachute distress rocket signals. The effect of this amendment is that, irrespective of length, ships of Class VIII (A) or XI, and ships of Class X which proceed beyond river limits, shall be required to carry six pyrotechnic distress signals.
