

## THE SOUTHERN LAKES FISHING REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 1

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date

of their notification in the Gazette.

2. Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "the Westland Acclimatization Society to a man eighteen years of age or over", and substituting the words "any acclimatization society".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations amend regulation 22 of the principal regulations consequentially on an amendment to the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, which now provide that whole season licences issued by any acclimatization society shall be available in that part of the Southern Lakes Acclimatization District which lies within the Westland Land District,
