**THE SOUTHERN LAKES FISHING REGULATIONS 1951,
AMENDMENT NO. 7**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of September 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) Regulation 27 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (e), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(e) On or in conjunction with any form of spoonbait or artificial minnow, any double or treble hook or other fixed multiple assembly of hooks any one hook of which has a greater distance than half an inch between the point and the nearest part of the shank of the hook; or”.

(2) Regulation 3 of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 6, is hereby revoked.

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 31, and substituting the following regulation:

“31. Every person taking a trout or quinnat salmon that does not exceed 12 in. in length from nose to tip of tail, or an Atlantic salmon that does not exceed 15 in. in length from nose to tip of tail, or a perch that does not exceed 6 in. in length from nose to tip of tail, shall immediately return it into the water from which it was taken, and, notwithstanding anything in regulation 38 hereof, whether it is alive or dead.”

4. Regulation 35 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 6) is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(b) That portion of the Waiau River which is within 100 yards of any part of the wharf belonging to the Sea Prince Lake Service Company Limited on the Waiau River, Lake Manapouri.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of regulation 2 is to permit the use in the Southern Lakes Fishing District of multiple hooks up to the maximum size specified in the regulations.

Regulation 3 requires anglers taking undersized fish to return them immediately into the waters from which they were taken, whether they are alive or dead.

Regulation 4 increases the area around the wharf in the Waiau River, Lake Manapouri, where fishing is prohibited.
