**THE SOUTHERN LAKES FISHING REGULATIONS 1971,
AMENDMENT NO. 6**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 23rd day of August 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1971* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1982.

(3) Regulation 4 of these regulations shall apply to all licences issued in respect of any period commencing on or after that day.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (e) of the definition of the term “open season” (as inserted by regulation 2 (2) of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 3) the word “October”, and substituting the word “November”.

3. Bag limit—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 22, and substituting the following regulation:

“22. (1) No person shall on any one day take (exclusive of fish dealt with under regulation 23 of these regulations) more than 3 acclimatised fish from any river flowing into any of the lakes Hawea, Wanaka, Wakatipu, Te Anau, or Manapouri.

“(2) In all other waters of the district, no person shall on any one day take (exclusive of fish dealt with under regulation 23 of these regulations) more than 6 acclimatised fish.

“(3) No person shall continue to fish in any waters in the district on any day on which he has already taken the maximum number of acclimatised fish that may be taken in those waters pursuant to subclause (1) or subclause (2) of this regulation.”

4. Increase in licence fees —(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 5), and substituting the Third Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 2 of, and the Schedule to, the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 5 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Southern Lakes Fishing Regulations 1971.

Regulation 2 shortens the open season on Diamond Creek by one month.

Regulation 3 reduces the number of acclimatised fish that may be taken on any one day from a limit of 12 taken in respect of the whole district to a limit of 3 from some areas and 6 for the remainder of the district.

Regulation 4 prescribes an increase in all licence fees. The whole-season fee increases from \$15 to \$20.
