

THE STATUS OF CHILDREN (FEES) REGULATIONS 1986

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 11 (1) (a) of the Status of Children Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1986.
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1986.
- 2. Fees—There shall be paid to the Registrar-General (as defined in section 9 (4) of the Status of Children Act 1969)—
 - (a) For every search of the index of paternity orders kept in the office of the Registrar-General, a fee of \$5:
 - (b) For every certified copy of a copy of an instrument filed in the office of the Registrar-General (being an instrument of the type described in section 8 (2) of the Status of Children Act 1969, a declaration of paternity, or a paternity order), a fee of \$10:
 - (c) For every certificate of search for the purposes of section 5A (2) (a) or section 6A (1) (b) of the Status of Children Act 1969, a fee of \$5.

- 3. Revocations—The following regulations are hereby revoked, namely:
- (a) The Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1980*:
- (b) The Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1980, Amendment No. 1†.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 May 1986, increase the fees payable to the Registrar-General in relation to records kept and documents filed under the Status of Children Act 1969.
