



THE STATUS OF CHILDREN (FEES) REGULATIONS 1987

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 8th day of June 1987

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 11 (1) (a) of the Status of Children Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1987.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1987.

2. Fees—There shall be paid to the Registrar-General (as defined in section 9 (4) of the Status of Children Act 1969)—

(a) For every search of the index of paternity orders kept in the office of the Registrar-General, a fee of \$6:

(b) For every certified copy of a copy of an instrument filed in the office of the Registrar-General (being an instrument of the type described in section 8 (2) of the Status of Children Act 1969, a declaration of paternity, or a paternity order), a fee of \$12:

(c) For every certificate of search for the purposes of section 5A (2) (a) or section 6A (1) (b) of the Status of Children Act 1969, a fee of \$6.

3. Amount of goods and services tax included—The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

4. Revocation—The Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1986* are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1987, increase the fees payable to the Registrar-General in relation to records kept and documents filed under the Status of Children Act 1969.

The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax.
