



**THE STATUS OF CHILDREN (FEES) REGULATIONS 1989**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At Wellington this 30th day of October 1989

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 11 (1) (a) of the Status of Children Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1989.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December 1989.

**2. Fees**—There shall be paid to the Registrar-General (as defined in section 9 (4) of the Status of Children Act 1969)—

- (a) For every search of the index of paternity orders kept in the office of the Registrar-General, a fee of \$7.50;
- (b) For every certified copy of a copy of an instrument filed in the office of the Registrar-General (being an instrument of the type described in section 8 (2) of the Status of Children Act 1969, a declaration of paternity, or a paternity order), a fee of \$15;
- (c) For every certificate of search for the purposes of section 5A (2) (a) or section 6A (1) (b) of the Status of Children Act 1969, a fee of \$7.50.

**3. Goods and services tax included**—The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

**4. Revocation**—The Status of Children (Fees) Regulations 1988\* are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 December 1989, increase the fees payable to the Registrar-General in relation to records kept and documents filed under the Status of Children Act 1969.

The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax.
