**THE SALE OF FOOD AND DRUGS AMENDING
REGULATIONS 1940.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of June, 1940.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Sale of Food and Drugs Amending Regulations 1940.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations relating to the Sale of Food and Drugs made on the 23rd day of June, 1924* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 82 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted :—

“ CIDER.

“ *General Standard.*

“ 82. (1) Cider shall be the product of the alcoholic fermentation of the expressed juice of sound apples, with or without the addition of sugar prior to, during, or after fermentation. It shall contain not more than fifteen parts per centum of proof spirit. To cider carbon dioxide may be added without declaration.

“ *Labelling.*

“ (2) In the label attached to every package containing cider there shall be written the word ‘ Dry ’ or the word ‘ Sweet ’, as the case may be, to which may be added (where such is the case) the word ‘ Sparkling ’. The word ‘ Champagne ’ shall not appear in the label attached to any package containing cider unless the contents of such package have been prepared by the champagne process.”

4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting, next after Regulation 82 thereof, the following additional regulation :—

“ APPLE WINE.

“ 82A. Any product of the alcoholic fermentation of the expressed juice of apples shall, when such product contains more than fifteen parts per centum of proof spirit, be labelled ‘ Apple Wine ’. The word ‘ Sherry ’, ‘ Madeira ’, or any wine name other than ‘ Apple ’ shall not appear in the label of apple wine.”
