ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Sale of Food and Drugs Emergency Regulations 1943.

2. In these regulations the expression "the Sale of Food and Drugs Regulations" means the regulations made under the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908, on the 23rd day of June, 1924, and published in the *Gazette* of the 26th day of the same month at page 1505.

3. While these regulations continue in force, Regulation 61 of the Sale of Food and Drugs Regulations shall be read and construed as if subclause (1) thereof (which relates to ice-cream) were amended by omitting the words "not less than ten parts per centum of milk-fat", and substituting the words "not less than eight parts per centum and not more than eight and one-half parts per centum of milk-fat".
