**THE SALE OF FOOD AND DRUGS EMERGENCY
REGULATIONS 1945**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 19th day of
December, 1945

Present :

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Sale of Food and Drugs Emergency Regulations 1945.

2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
“ Food Controller ” means the Food Controller appointed under the Foodstuffs Emergency Regulations 1939* :

“ Service Department ” means the Navy Department, the Army Department, or the Air Department, and includes the United States Joint Purchasing Board :

“ The said Act ” means the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908 :

“ War surplus foodstuffs ” means food which has been declared by any Service Department to be surplus to war requirements, and the distribution of which for purposes of sale has been approved by the Food Controller, whether before or after the commencement of these regulations.

(2) For the purposes of the general interpretation hereof, these regulations shall be deemed to be made under the said Act, and, unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used herein have the same meaning as in the said Act.

3. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Sale of Food and Drugs Regulations made on the 23rd day of June, 1924*, it shall be lawful for any person, while these regulations continue in force, to sell any war surplus foodstuffs in the packages in which they are contained on the date of these regulations, although the packages do not comply with the requirements as to labelling contained in the said regulations.

(2) Except as expressly hereinbefore provided, nothing in this regulation shall affect or derogate from the provisions of the said Act or any regulations thereunder.
