## THE SHIPPING (SURVEY OF FISHING BOATS) ORDER 1965

Pursuant to the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Shipping (Survey of Fishing Boats) Order 1965.
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 15th day of October 1965.
- 2. This order applies to fishing boats exceeding 40 feet but not exceeding 60 feet register length.
- 3. On and after the date of the commencement of this order fishing boats to which this order applies shall be liable to survey in the manner provided in Part IV of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. The effect of this order is that on and after 15 October 1965 fishing boats exceeding 40 ft register length but not exceeding 60 ft register length (which at present are exempt from survey under section 246 (2) (a) of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952) will cease to be exempt from survey, and will become liable to survey in the manner provided in Part IV of that Act.
