### THE SHIPPING (MANNING OF FISHING BOATS) REGULATIONS 1986

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

#### HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 17, 55, and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Transport made after consideration by the Minister of a report on the proposed regulations by the Marine Council, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### **REGULATIONS**

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Shipping (Manning of Fishing Boats) Regulations 1986.
  - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1986.

- 2. Interpretation—In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
  - "The Act" means the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952:
  - "Approved bridge control" means such control mechanism and instrumentation located adjacent to the helmsman's main steering position as is sufficient in the opinion of a Surveyor of Ships for the safe operation and effective control of the main propulsion machinery:
  - "Certificate" means a certificate of competency or a certificate of service issued by the Secretary in accordance with the Act; and includes any qualification recognised in New Zealand by the Shipping (Recognition of Certificates of Competency) Order 1975\* as equivalent to any such certificate:
  - "Crew member" means a bona fide member of the crew who is over the age of 15 years and is engaged in the business of the boat, being a member who is remunerated for his or her services and has contributed no other consideration for his or her carriage:
  - "Overall length", in relation to any fishing boat, means the length of the boat measured from the foreside of the head of the stem to the extreme after end of the boat:
  - "Qualified fishing deckhand" means a person who is the holder of a certificate as qualified fishing deckhand issued under the Act.
- **3. Application**—These regulations shall apply to every New Zealand fishing boat other than any fishing boat that—
  - (a) Is propelled solely by oars or by sail; or
  - (b) Does not exceed 6 metres in overall length.
- **4. Manning**—(1) The owner of every fishing boat to which these regulations apply shall ensure that the boat carries a duly certificated master or master engineer, and such crew, as is specified in the scale set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) Nothing in subclause (1) of this regulation shall prevent the carriage of additional crew members, provided the total number of persons carried does not exceed the number for whom accommodation is provided and lifesaving appliances are carried.
- **5. Alternative certificates**—The certificates specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to these regulations shall be accepted as alternatives to the appropriate certificates specified in the first column of that Schedule.
- **6. Saving**—Notwithstanding anything in these regulations, any person who, by virtue of being the holder of any certificate of competency, certificate of service, licence, or endorsement of any such certificate or licence, was, immediately before the commencement of these regulations, entitled under the Act to serve in a particular capacity on a fishing boat to which these regulations apply, shall continue to be entitled so to serve as if these regulations had not been made.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE

In this Schedule, "engineering qualification" means any of the following qualifications, being a qualification of a kind (steam  $\sigma r$  motor) appropriate to the fishing boat's propulsion system:

- (a) An endorsement to act as commercial launchmaster:
- (b) A certificate as second-class diesel trawler engineer, or any certificate specified in this Schedule as an alternative to such a certificate:
- (c) A certificate as marine engine driver:
- (d) A certificate as engineer of restricted-limit motor ship.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 August 1986, replace the Shipping (Manning of Fishing Boats) Notice 1973 and its amendments. The regulations specify manning levels for fishing boats by reference to the new certificates of competency provided for in the Masters and Mates (Foreign-Going and Home-Trade) Examination Regulations 1985, the Masters and Mates (Coastal, Fishing, and Pleasure Boats) Examination Regulations 1986, and the Marine Engineers (Examination) Regulations 1986.
