AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 229 of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February 1992.

2. Remuneration of other members—(1) Regulation 33 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by—

(a) Omitting the expression “\$50”, and substituting the expression “\$100”; and

(b) Omitting the expression “\$2,500”, and substituting the expression “\$5,200”.

(2) Nothing in regulation 33 of the principal regulations, as amended by subclause (1) of this regulation, applies in respect of a meeting of a licensing trust or any committee of a licensing trust held before the 1st day of February 1992.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase, with effect from 1 February 1992, the rate of remuneration payable to members of a licensing trust for attendance at meetings of the trust or any committee of the trust.

At present a licensing trust may pay \$50 to a member in respect of each such meeting attended subject to a maximum payment of \$2,500 in any financial year. The amendment increases the amount payable for attendance at meetings to \$100 and increases the maximum amount payable in any financial year to \$5,200.
