THE SUPPLY OF LIQUOR TO SOLDIERS EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 28th day of February, 1940.

THE HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Supply of Liquor to Soldiers Emergency Regulations 1940.

2. No person shall sell any intoxicating liquor to any member of the Defence Forces of New Zealand, when in uniform, for consumption elsewhere than on the premises where it is sold.

3. No person shall give or supply or act as agent for the purchase of any intoxicating liquor for any member of the Defence Forces, when in uniform, for consumption elsewhere than on the premises where it is given, supplied, or purchased.

4. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquor to any member of the Defence Forces, when in uniform, and being carried in or on any railway train, railway carriage, rail car, or any other vehicle or conveyance, not being a ship, for the time being used for the carriage of the public or members of the Defence Forces.

5. No member of the Defence Forces shall, when in uniform, bring or cause to be brought any intoxicating liquor into or upon, or have any intoxicating liquor in his possession while he is in or on, any railway train, railway carriage, rail car, or any other vehicle or conveyance, not being a ship, for the time being used for the carriage of the public or members of the Defence Forces.
