ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 22nd day of April 1974

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. N. E. KIRK PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1973\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Fresh, smoked, and frozen fish exempted**—(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “Fish, fresh, smoked, frozen, or canned”, and substituting the words “Fish, canned”.

(2) The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after clause 3, the following clause:

“3A. Fresh, smoked, and frozen fish.”

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations remove fresh, smoked, and frozen fish from the list of Category A items. Canned fish remains a Category A item.

In addition, fresh, smoked, and frozen fish is added to the list of exempted goods.

NOTE—The price of fresh and smoked fish is controlled by the Price Freeze Regulations 1974.
