REVOCATION ORDER 1979**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 4th day of April 1979

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Economic Stabilisation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

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O R D E R

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations Revocation Order 1979.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 6th day of April 1979.

2. Revocations—The regulations and notices specified in the Schedule to this order are hereby revoked.

3. Savings—(1) Notwithstanding the revocations effected by clause 2 of this order, but subject to subclauses (2) and (3) of this clause, the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974 shall continue in force—

- (a) In relation to the prices charged by any manufacturer of Category B goods for Category B goods manufactured by him and in relation to the prices charged by any supplier of Group 1 services for Group 1 services supplied by him, until the date upon which he could next have lawfully increased the price of those goods or services under regulation 11 of those regulations (including the proviso to that regulation); and
- (b) Except as provided in subclause (2) of this clause, in relation to the prices charged by any supplier of Group 2 services for Group 2 services supplied by him, until the date on which he could next have lawfully increased the price of those services under regulation 11 of those regulations (including the proviso to that regulation).

(2) Nothing in subclause (1) (b) of this clause shall apply in relation to the prices charged for the provision of accommodation or meals (including the provision of liquor served with meals) in any hotel, private hotel, motel, guest house, or hostel.

(3) Nothing in subclause (1) of this regulation shall continue the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974 in force beyond the 6th day of October 1979.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on the 6th day of April 1979, revokes—

- (a) The Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974 (which imposed a general system of price control in respect of goods and services); and
- (b) The Price Freeze Regulations 1974 (which prescribed maximum wholesale prices and maximum retail prices in respect of fish); and
- (c) The Economic Stabilisation (Slaughtering and Processing) Charges Regulations 1978 (which limited the increases in remuneration that could be claimed as admissible costs, in calculating, for the purposes of the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974, increases in charges for the slaughtering of stock or for the processing of stock or for both in any export slaughterhouse or abattoir).

A system of price surveillance is being instituted under two new sets of regulations called the Price Surveillance Regulations 1979 and the Financial Services Regulations 1979. These regulations will supplement the provisions of the Commerce Act 1975.

The revocation of the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974 accordingly has the effect of releasing, as from the commencement of the 6th day of April 1979, from the controls imposed by those regulations—

- (a) The prices of goods sold or offered for sale by any importer, wholesaler, or retailer; and
- (b) The prices charged for the provision of accommodation or meals (including the provision of liquor served with meals) in any hotel, private hotel, motel, guest house, or hostel.

The prices charged by manufacturers of Category B goods for Category B goods manufactured by them and the prices charged by suppliers of Group 1 Services or Group 2 Services (other than the services specified in paragraph (b) above) remain subject to the controls imposed by the Stabilisation of Prices Regulations 1974 until the date upon which those prices could next have been lawfully increased under regulation 11 of those regulations (but not in any event beyond the 6th day of October 1979).
