ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 28th day of July, 1948

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 53 of the Superannuation Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Superannuation (Definition of Salarv) Order 1948.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1948.

3. The Superannuation (Cost of Living) Order 1940,* the Superannuation (Definition of Salary) Order 1942[†], and the Superannuation (Definition of Salary) Order 1942, Amendment No. 1⁺, are hereby revoked.

4. The allowances specified in the Schedule hereto shall, with respect to any contributor to the Government Superannuation Fund, be deemed to be salary for the purposes of Part II of the Superannuation Act, 1947.

5. Any allowance in respect of which any person was contributing to any Superannuation Fund immediately before the commencement of this Order by virtue of Regulation 4 of the Superannuation (Definition of Salary) Order 1942[†] shall, with respect to that person, be deemed to be salary for the purposes of Part II of the Superannuation Act, 1947.

SCHEDULE

ALLOWANCES DEEMED TO BE SALARY

1. Allowance payable to a contributor to bring his salary to the minimum remuneration for the time being in force in respect of adult officers.

2. Allowance payable to a contributor to bring his salary to the minimum remuneration for the time being in force in respect of married officers.

3. Allowance payable to a contributor employed in the Government Railways Department who has become unable to perform his normal duties because his standard of colour perception, visual acuity, or hearing fails to reach the departmental standard or because of disablement attributable to service in any of His Majesty's Armed Forces, whether established in New Zealand or elsewhere, and who has consequently been reduced in status or pay.
