ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 16th day of March 1987

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to section 212 of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 14, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1987.

2. Court fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 12), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

3. Revocation—The Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 12 are hereby consequentially amended by revoking regulations 3 and 4 and the Schedule to those regulations.

NEW SECOND SCHEDULE TO PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

(2) Hearing any information or charge	30
(3) Copy of proceedings or judgment—	
(a) Not exceeding 5 pages	5
(b) Exceeding 5 pages	15
(4) Certified copy of entry in criminal records	20
(5) Application for removal of disqualification or for partial exemption from disqualification under the Transport Act 1962	100

NOTE—(1) Where pursuant to any enactment several offences are charged in the one information (not being offences charged in the alternative), the fees to be taken shall be assessed as if separate informations had been laid in respect of the several offences charged.

(2) The foregoing fees are not to be taken in proceedings under the Family Proceedings Act 1980, or in proceedings by way of complaint or in proceedings under Part V of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957.”

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1987, increase the Court fees payable under the Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958.
