ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 12th day of October 1981

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 41 of the Surveyors Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

—

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Surveyors Professional Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Surveyors Professional Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1981.

2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 36, and substituting the following regulation:

“36. The following fees shall be payable to the Board—

“(a) For registration as a surveyor under the Act	30
“(b) For the issue of a certificate of registration as a surveyor ...	10
“(c) For the restoration of a name to the register	30
“(d) For the issue of a letter of accreditation	15
“(e) For an application to sit the written examination specified in regulation 6 (1) of these regulations	25
“(f) For an application for a review of an examination under regulation 16 of these regulations	10

“(g) For an application to sit the professional interview examination conducted under regulation 7 of these regulations 75.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 November 1981, increase the fees payable under the Surveyors Professional Regulations 1977.

The fees are increased by 50 percent, except the fee to sit the written examination which is increased by 66 percent, and the fees for the issue of a certificate of registration, and review of an examination paper, which are each increased by 100 percent.
