THE SEA-FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 17

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Sea-fisheries Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 17.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Sea-fisheries Regulations 1939* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
- 4. Part X of the principal regulations is amended by adding the following regulation thereto:—
- "3. (1) No person shall dredge or trawl for mussels during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1945, and extending to the 31st day of March, 1948 (both days inclusive), in the tidal lands and tidal waters described in clause (2) of this regulation.

"(2) The tidal lands and tidal waters referred to in clause (1) of this regulation are the following:—

"Coromandel Peninsula

"(a) That area of tidal lands and tidal waters in that part of Kikowhakarere Bay, Coromandel Peninsula, lying inside a straight line drawn in a northerly direction from the westernmost point of the reef on the southern end of Long Bay to the concrete house in Nicholl's Bay:

"(b) That area of tidal lands and tidal waters in Coromandel (Waihau) Harbour lying inside of a straight line drawn in a north-easterly direction from the north-easternmost point of Waihau (Purser's) Island to Quarry Point on the southern extremity of the peninsula forming the western side of McGregor Bay, and inside of a straight line drawn in a north-westerly direction from the westernmost point of Esk Point to the westernmost point of Tawiti Point."

5. Part XVII of the principal regulations is amended by prefixing the numeral "1" to the text thereof, and by adding thereto the following regulation:—

"2. The close season for seals prescribed by Regulation 1 hereof is hereby extended until and including the 31st day of March, 1948."

6. Part XVIII of the principal regulations is amended by adding the following regulations thereto:—

"23. (1) From the date of coming into force of these regulations until the 31st day of March, 1946 (both days inclusive), notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of this Part of these regulations, no person shall take or attempt to take toheroas from that part of the beach on the west coast of the North Island known as the Ninetymile Beach lying northwards from the point where the road from Ahipara enters the beach for approximately fifty-five miles to Scott's Point, nor shall any person while on or in the vicinity of the above-described part of Ninety-mile Beach be in possession of any toheroa.

"(2) Nevertheless it shall be lawful for any person engaged in line-fishing from the beach to take or be in possession of not more

than six toheroas at any one time for use as bait."
