ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of March 1953

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Standards Act 1941, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the Standards Regulations 1947, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Standards Regulations 1947\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2.** Regulation 9 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) By omitting from subclause (2) the words “to each person who has regularly obtained a copy of the standard specification which has been revoked, amended, or revised, and shall likewise give notice”:
- (b) By omitting from subclause (3) the words “and shall maintain a record of all persons to whom copies of such standard specifications have been sold or distributed”.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]*

These regulations abolish the obligation on the part of the executive officer of the Standards Council to maintain a record of persons to whom copies of standard specifications have been sold or distributed and to give them notice of revocations, amendments, and revisions of the specifications.
