## THE SHIPPING (FEES) REGULATIONS 1970

RICHARD WILD, Administrator of the Government

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of May 1970

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1970.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1970.

**2. Interpretation**—In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952;

“The Department” means the Marine Department;

“Crew” includes the master and every officer, seaman, and apprentice;

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine;

“Seaman” means any person employed or engaged in any capacity on board any ship (except a master, pilot, or apprentice);

“Superintendent” means a Superintendent of Mercantile Marine appointed pursuant to section 10 of the Act; and includes his deputy.

**3. Fees**—(1) There shall be paid for the services specified in the second column of the Schedule to these regulations, performed under the sections of the Act specified in the first column of that Schedule, the fees specified in the third column of that Schedule.

**4. Ships assigned dual tonnages**—Where under these regulations the amount of any fee is fixed in relation to the gross tonnage or register tonnage of a ship, then, in the case of a ship to which pursuant to the tonnage regulations of the Act alternative gross tonnages or alternative register tonnages, as the case may be, have been assigned, the fee payable shall be assessed in relation to the higher of those tonnages.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations prescribe new scales of fees for various services afforded by the Marine Department in relation to shipping. They do not include fees in respect of the examination of masters, mates, and engineers and the issue of certificates of competency to masters, mates, and engineers.

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Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 28 May 1970.

These regulations are administered in the Marine Department.
