



**THE SURVEY REGULATIONS 1972, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

PURSUANT to section 41 of the Surveyors Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Survey Regulations 1972, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Surveyors Regulations 1972\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Hanging traverses**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 25, and substituting the following regulation:

“25. (1) No hanging traverse shall consist of more than 1 line.

“(2) No such line shall exceed 50 m in length on any Class A survey.

“(3) No such line shall exceed 100 m in length on any Class B survey.

“(4) No such line shall exceed 500 m in length on any Class C survey.

“(5) Where any such traverse is used, independent measurements to check bearing, distance, and pegging ties shall be recorded in the field notes.”

(2) Regulation 16 of the Survey Regulations 1972, Amendment No. 1 is hereby consequentially revoked.

**3. Land transfer plans and Class C surveys**—Regulation 39 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the expression “regulations 1 to 36”, the expression “and 42A”.

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#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the Survey Regulations 1972 in 2 respects.

Changes are made in the maximum permitted length of lines of hanging traverses. The maximum lengths are:

50 m in the case of Class A surveys:

100 m in the case of Class B surveys:

500 m in the case of Class C surveys.

At present the maximum length in all cases is 40 m.

The amendment to regulation 39 of the principal regulations ensures that Class C surveys can be accepted for plans prepared for the purposes of the Land Transfer Act 1952.
