



**THE SHIPPING (FEES) REGULATIONS 1982,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of July 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL BY HIS DEPUTY IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to sections 501 and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952,
His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and
consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1982* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Fees for initial certificates—Part I of the First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a), and substituting the paragraph (a) set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

3. Fees for measurement of ship's tonnage—Part VIII B of the First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (d), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(d) For measurement of ships under the Second Schedule to the Shipping Tonnage Regulations 1976*:

Where a periodical survey, as required by section 224A (1) (b) of the Act, is carried out on any fishing boat the survey fee for the issue of a certificate of survey valid for more than 6 months shall be payable at the rate prescribed in subparagraph (vii) of this paragraph appropriate to the tonnage of the fishing boat.

Where, for the issue of any of the above certificates, or for the purposes of a survey pursuant to section 224A (1) (b) of the Act an inspection of the radio installation is carried out by a Radio Surveyor there shall be payable an additional fee of \$75 for ships not exceeding 1600 gross tons and \$100 for ships exceeding 1600 gross tons.

Where a ship is surveyed for the issue of 2 or more certificates of survey, there shall be payable only the fee for the certificate for which the highest fee is payable."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations reduce the fees payable under the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1982 for an initial certificate of survey and safety certificate by between 70 and 85 percent. They also provide that no fee is payable for the measurement of ship's tonnage under the Shipping Tonnage Regulations 1976 where the measurement is carried out concurrently with a survey for a certificate of survey. The previous fee was \$150.
