

## THE SHIPPING (FEES) REGULATIONS 1984, AMENDMENT NO. 1

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

#### HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 501 and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1984\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
  - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1986.
- 2. Examination fees and fees for certificates and licences, etc.—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 5, and substituting the following regulation:
- "5. The fees specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations shall be payable to the Ministry of Transport in respect of the matters specified in that Schedule, being matters relating to examinations for, and the issue of, certificates, licences, and endorsements."

**3. New Second Schedule substituted**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule, and substituting the new Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 August 1986, revise and replace the Second Schedule to the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1984. That Schedule prescribes fees for examinations for certificates of competency and licences, and for various related matters.

The new Second Schedule prescribes new scales of fees for these examinations and the various services. It also makes provision for the new certificates of competency and other matters prescribed in the Masters and Mates (Foreign-Going and Home-Trade) Examination Regulations 1985, the Masters and Mates (Coastal, Fishing, and Pleasure Boats) Examination Regulations 1986, the Marine Engineers (Examination) Regulations 1986, the Shipping (Manning and Watchkeeping) Regulations 1986, and the Shipping Radio Rules 1967, Amendment No. 2.
