

THE SHIPPING (FEES) REGULATIONS 1986

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 21st day of July 1986

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to sections 501 and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1986.
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1986.
- **2. Interpretation**—In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "The Act" means the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952:
 - "Crew" includes the master and every officer, seaman, and apprentice:
 - "Docking survey" means a survey of the underwater part of the hull and fittings of a ship with the ship clear of the water:
 - "Minister" means the Minister of Transport:
 - "Ministry" means the Ministry of Transport:
 - "Seaman" means any person employed or engaged in any capacity on board any ship (except a master, pilot, or apprentice):
 - "Superintendent" means a Superintendent of Mercantile Marine appointed under section 10 of the Act; and includes the Superintendent's deputy.

- **3. Fees**—(1) There shall be paid for the services specified in the First Schedule to these regulations the fees specified in that Schedule.
- (2) In addition to the fees specified in the First Schedule to these regulations, the person liable to pay those fees shall pay the following charges:
 - (a) Whenever a Surveyor in the employment of the Ministry is engaged in survey work—
 - (i) On weekdays before 8 a.m. or after 5 p.m., \$65 for each hour or part thereof, with a minimum of \$130 when attendance is required before 7 a.m. or after 6 p.m.:
 - (ii) On Saturdays, Sundays, and other days when the offices of the Ministry are normally closed, \$110 for each hour or part of an hour, with a minimum charge of \$330:
 - (b) Whenever an officer in the employment of the Ministry who is providing the service in respect of which the fees are payable is engaged in Mercantile Marine Office work—
 - (i) On weekdays before 8 a.m. or after 5 p.m., \$65 for each hour or part of an hour, with a minimum of \$130 when attendance is required before 7 a.m. or after 6 p.m.:
 - (ii) On Saturdays, Sundays, and other days when the Mercantile Marine Office is normally closed, \$110 for each hour or part of an hour, with a minimum charge of \$330.
- (3) In addition to the fees specified in the First Schedule to these regulations, the person liable to pay those fees shall pay the following charges or, where more than one ship is presented for survey at any place, the appropriate portion of the charge calculated according to the number of ships presented there for survey:
 - (a) Whenever a Surveyor in the employment of the Ministry is required to travel by land or sea more than 50 kilometres from the nearest office of the Ministry at which a Surveyor is based to the place where the ship is presented for survey, \$65 for each hour or part of an hour spent travelling beyond 50 kilometres from that office for the purpose of the survey:
 - (b) Whenever a ship is presented for survey at the Chatham Islands, Stewart Island, or Milford Sound, or where, by prior arrangement with the person liable to pay any fee, a Surveyor travels by air to where the ship is presented for survey,—
 - (i) The cost of return air travel for the most practicable route between that place and the nearest appropriate office of the Ministry at which a Surveyor is based; and
 - (ii) A charge of \$65 for each hour or part of an hour spent travelling between that place and that office for the purpose of the survey.
- (4) Where any fee under this regulation or the First Schedule to these regulations (other than a fee payable under subclause (3) of this regulation) is calculated on an hourly basis, the fee shall not include any travelling time involved.
- (5) The fees payable under the foregoing provisions of this regulation shall be paid as follows:

- 4. Ships assigned dual tonnage—Where under these regulations the amount of any fee is fixed in relation to the gross tonnage of a ship, then, in the case of a ship to which under the tonnage regulations made pursuant to the Act alternative gross tonnages have been assigned, the fee payable shall be assessed in relation to the higher of those tonnages.
- 5. Examination fees and fees for certificates and licences, etc.—The fees specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations shall be payable to the Ministry of Transport in respect of the matters specified in that Schedule, being matters relating to examinations for, and the issue of, certificates, licences, and endorsements.
- 6. Revocations—The Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1984* and the Shipping (Fees) Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 1† are hereby revoked.

Where a periodical survey as required by section 224A (1) (b) of the Act is carried out on any fishing boat or restricted-limit ship the fee prescribed in this paragraph shall be payable at the appropriate rate; except that where no docking survey is required the fee shall be reduced by 25 percent.

Where a certificate other than an initial certificate is issued for a period of validity of 6 months or less the fee payable shall be 50 percent of the fee that would otherwise be payable under this

paragraph.

Where, for the issue of any of the above certificates, or for the purposes of a survey required by section 224A (1) (b) of the Act an inspection of the radio installation is carried out by a Radio Surveyor there shall be payable an additional fee of \$100.

Where a ship is surveyed for the issue of 2 or more certificates of survey, there shall be payable only the fee for the certificate for which the highest fee is payable.

In the case of a ship built in New Zealand the fee for the survey for the issue of a certificate of survey prescribed in this paragraph shall be payable in addition to any fees required to be paid under the Shipping (Construction Fees) Notice 1986*.

(b) Survey for the following certificates, except in cases specified in paragraphs (c) to (f) of this Part of this Schedule:

(i) Certificate of survey and safety certificate as a passenger ship engaged on international voyages (referred to in the Act as a general safety certificate)

(ii) Certificate of survey as a cargo ship engaged on international voyages, and if over 500 gross tonnage, a safety-construction certificate and safety-equipment certificate or a qualified safety-construction certificate or qualified safety-equipment certificate together with an exemption certificate

(iii) Certificate of survey as a home-trade passenger ship (iv) Certificate of survey as a home-trade passenger ship engaged on daylight excursions
